Thanks to the 2nd Annual 1000 Women Strong-Habitat Sangamon campaign and many dedicated Habitat volunteers who spent the last three months building, Sonia Kenney is about to realize a life-long dream – owning a simple, decent home that will provide long-term stability for her family. Habitat for Humanity of Sangamon County (HFHSC) invites you to share in the joy of this achievement at the Dedication Celebration for this home on Thursday, June 27th, 5 pm, at 1438 N 3rd Street.

"I'm so lucky that they (Habitat) have worked with me because of school and my kids' sports and activities," she said. "My (program) Nurturer has been awesome in helping me any way I need. I want a place to call my own," she said. "I want a place that in 20 years my kids can say, 'We're going back to mom's house.' My advice to others, don't ever give up, ever, because if you work hard you can make your dreams come true," Sonia said. "I'm definitely trying to complete everything even if I'm exhausted, because I know it will be worth it in the end."

Habitat homes are not given away for free. Sonia will pay a zero percent interest mortgage (provided by Habitat), property taxes and homeowners insurance. This zero-interest, affordable mortgage is invested back into Habitat's program to build more homes. In addition, prior to building, Partner Families in Habitat's Homeownership Program take classes on topics that include budgeting, taxes and home maintenance and also invest hundreds of "sweat equity" hours.
